The Betty Brinn Children's Museum follows all guidelines issued by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and the Milwaukee Health Department to keep our environment clean and safe for visitors. These are the steps we are taking to keep you healthy during your visit:

The Museum has daily, weekly and monthly cleaning procedures in place for the exhibit floor. Following recommendations by the CDC, the Museum ensures the daily cleaning of high-traffic surfaces throughout the Museum including exhibit props, hand railings, door knobs and water fountains. The Museum uses an EPA registered and patented dry-on-contact sanitizer that kills 99.99% of germs, bacteria and viruses, including H1N1.

Visitors are encouraged to use hand sanitizer stations located throughout our exhibit areas, at the *Information Desk* and near the Museum elevator.

The Museum's education staff instructs visiting field trip groups about proper hand washing and ways to stay healthy. In addition, all field trip groups will be given hand sanitizer before and after their visit to the Museum.

The Museum utilizes "Yuck Bags" on the exhibit floor, receptacles for visitors to place props that need to be cleaned.

Guides posted in Museum restrooms show children how to wash their hands thoroughly, and encourage adults to teach their children the proper techniques.

The Museum's restroom surfaces are thoroughly cleaned throughout the day.

What caregivers can do

Keep your children home if they exhibit symptoms of the flu (persistent cough, fever, body aches, nausea).

Encourage your children to cover their nose and mouth with a tissue or with their sleeve when they cough or sneeze.

Teach your children how to properly wash their hands.

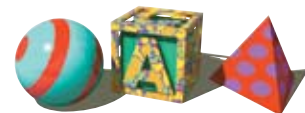
